	Stand and lecture	Lecture with some group discussion	Group work and activity
Large class	<p>Classroom Collaboration: Create an announcement-only Space, so everyone will know where to go for the latest class information.</p> <p>Virtual Meetings: Record the class so that those who missed it, can watch it. People can also join the class remotely.</p>	<p>Classroom Collaboration: Create an announcement-only Space for your class, and another Space for your class to carry on conversation.</p> <p>Consider breaking open conversation into groups if your class is very large.</p> <p>Virtual Meetings: Students can still join class even if not in person.</p>	<p>Virtual Meetings: Allow students to attend class remotely when needed, and record the class.</p> <p>Consider hosting large “problem solving” meetings, where you can help students on mass before big exams.</p> <p>Classroom Collaboration: Create an announcement Space for your class, and group Spaces for your students so they can work together in smaller groups.</p>
Small class	<p>Virtual Meetings: If students are unable to attend, they can join on Webex, or watch the recording later.</p> <p>Classroom Collaboration: Add tasks, documents, and videos to an announcement-only Space, so everyone has access to key information.</p> <p>Have a second Space where everyone can chat and problem solve as a group.</p>	<p>Classroom Collaboration: Create a Space for your students so they can peer to peer problem solve.</p> <p>Consider breaking students into groups of 4 or 5, for project Spaces.</p> <p>Virtual Meetings: Students can still participate remotely in class, even if not in person.</p>	<p>Office Hours: Schedule a 15 minute slot with each student, to meet before the semester starts.</p> <p>Virtual Meetings: Invite students who are joining remotely to present and talk to the class.</p> <p>Classroom Collaboration: Have a Space for full classroom teamwork and discussion, and breakout groups for smaller team work where you facilitate.</p>
